Exodus: The God Who Is Able

God is able to deliver His people so we can joyfully trust Him and wholeheartedly follow Him.

Exodus 4:1-17

Then Moses answered, “But behold, they will not believe me or listen to my voice, for they will say, ‘The Lord did not appear to you.’”² The Lord said to him, “What is that in your hand?” He said, “A staff.”³ And he said, “Throw it on the ground.”

So he threw it on the ground, and it became a serpent, and Moses ran from it. ⁴ But the Lord said to Moses, “Put out your hand and catch it by the tail”—so he put out his hand and caught it, and it became a staff in his hand— ⁵ “that they may believe that the Lord,




