God redeems people so that we will bring honor to Him in worship and experience joy in knowing Him and trusting in His mercy.



Hard hearts that lead to disobedience, a resistance to God's will, and result in God's judgment.

VS

Willing hearts that lead to obedience and receive God's blessing
