# Exodus: The God Who Redeems

God redeems His people from the captivity of His enemies so that His people can know Him, experience freedom, and worship Him.

## Exodus 12:33-51

The Egyptians were urgent with the people to send them out of the land in haste. For they said, “We shall all be dead.”<sup>34</sup> So the people took their dough before it was leavened, their kneading bowls being bound up in their cloaks on their shoulders.

<sup>44</sup> but every slave that is bought for money may eat of it after you have circumcised him. <sup>45</sup> No foreigner or hired worker may eat of it.

## Exodus 12:33-51

<sup>46</sup> It shall be eaten in one house; you shall not take any of the flesh outside the house, and you shall not break any of its bones. <sup>47</sup> All the congregation of Israel shall keep it.

## Exodus 12:33-51

48 If a stranger shall sojourn with you and would keep the Passover to the Lord, let all his males be circumcised. Then he may come near and keep it; he shall be as a native of the land.

## Exodus 12:33-51

But no uncircumcised person shall eat of it. <sup>49</sup> There shall be one law for the native and for the stranger who sojourns among you.”

## Exodus 12:33-51

<sup>50</sup> All the people of Israel did just as the Lord commanded Moses and Aaron.

<sup>51</sup> And on that very day the Lord brought the people of Israel out of the land of Egypt by their hosts.

## Colossians 2:13-15

And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, <sup>14</sup> by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands.

## Colossians 2:13-15

This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.

<sup>15</sup> He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.



## Ephesians 4:4-12

There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—<sup>5</sup>one Lord, one faith, one baptism, <sup>6</sup>one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

## Ephesians 4:4-12

<sup>7</sup>But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. <sup>8</sup>Therefore it says, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men." <sup>9</sup>(In saying, "He ascended,"

what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower regions, the earth? <sup>10</sup> He who descended is the one who also ascended far above all the heavens, that he might fill all things.)

## Ephesians 4:4-12

<sup>11</sup> And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, <sup>12</sup> to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,



## Galatians 5:1,13-14

For freedom Christ has set us free;  
stand firm therefore, and do not submit  
again to a yoke of slavery

## Galatians 5:1,13-14

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. <sup>14</sup> For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”
