Foundation for the relationship:

Remember why I have done this.

Deuteronomy 7:6-9

“For you are a people holy to the Lord your God. The Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for his treasured possession, out of all the peoples who are on the face of the earth. ⁷ It was not because you were more in number than any other people

Deuteronomy 7:6-9

that the Lord set his love on you and chose you, for you were the fewest of all peoples, ⁸ but it is because the Lord loves you and is keeping the oath that he swore to your fathers,

Deuteronomy 7:6-9

that the Lord has brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the house of slavery, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt. ⁹ Know therefore that the Lord your God is God,

Deuteronomy 7:6-9

the faithful God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, to a thousand generations,



The Law is not the means of their salvation. They don't keep the law and then God redeems them/delivers them. This is a reminder that they have already been delivered and the Law is what is expected of a people already redeemed.
