<sup>11</sup> Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves.

<sup>12</sup> “Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father.



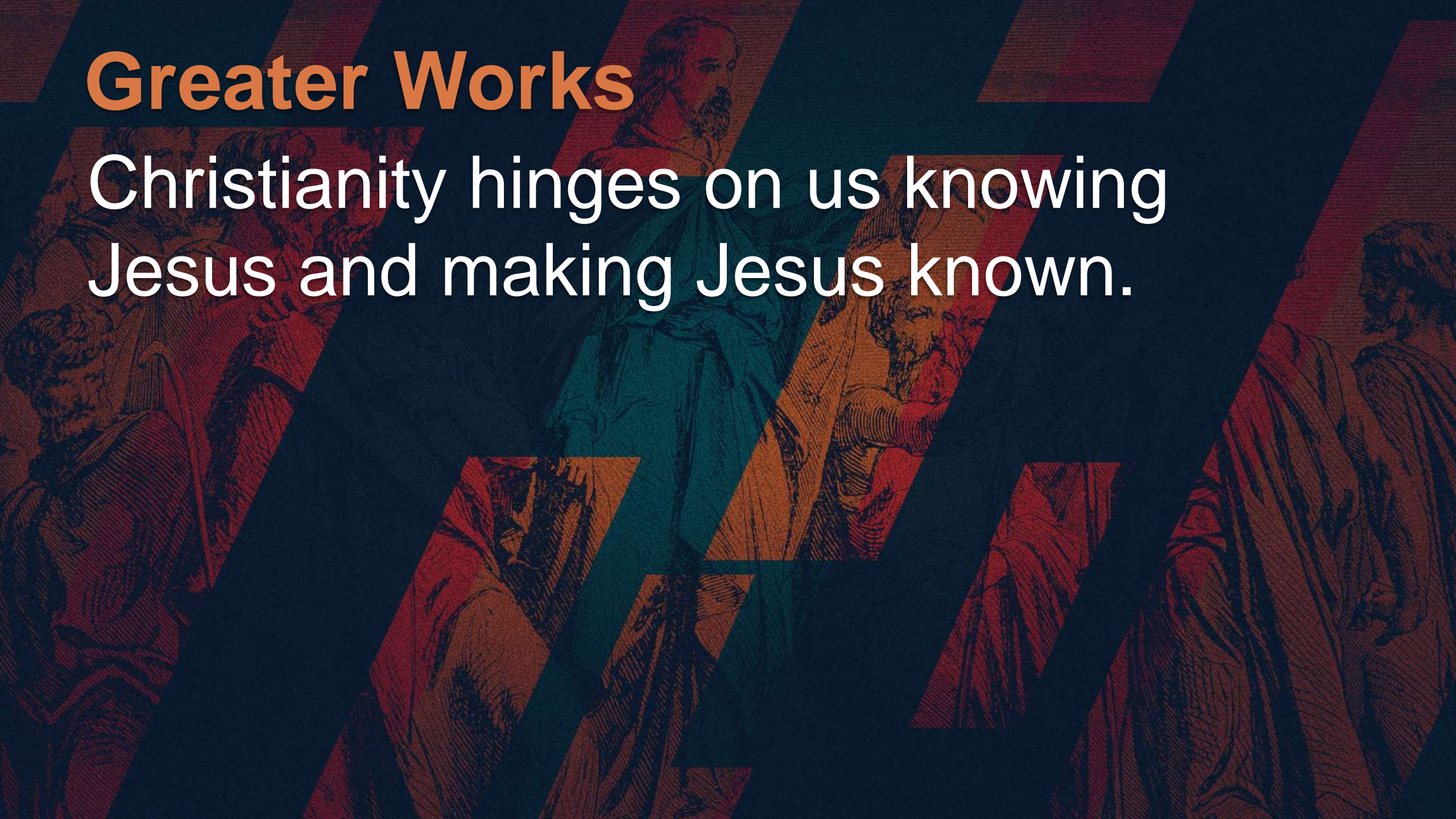
# John 14:8-14

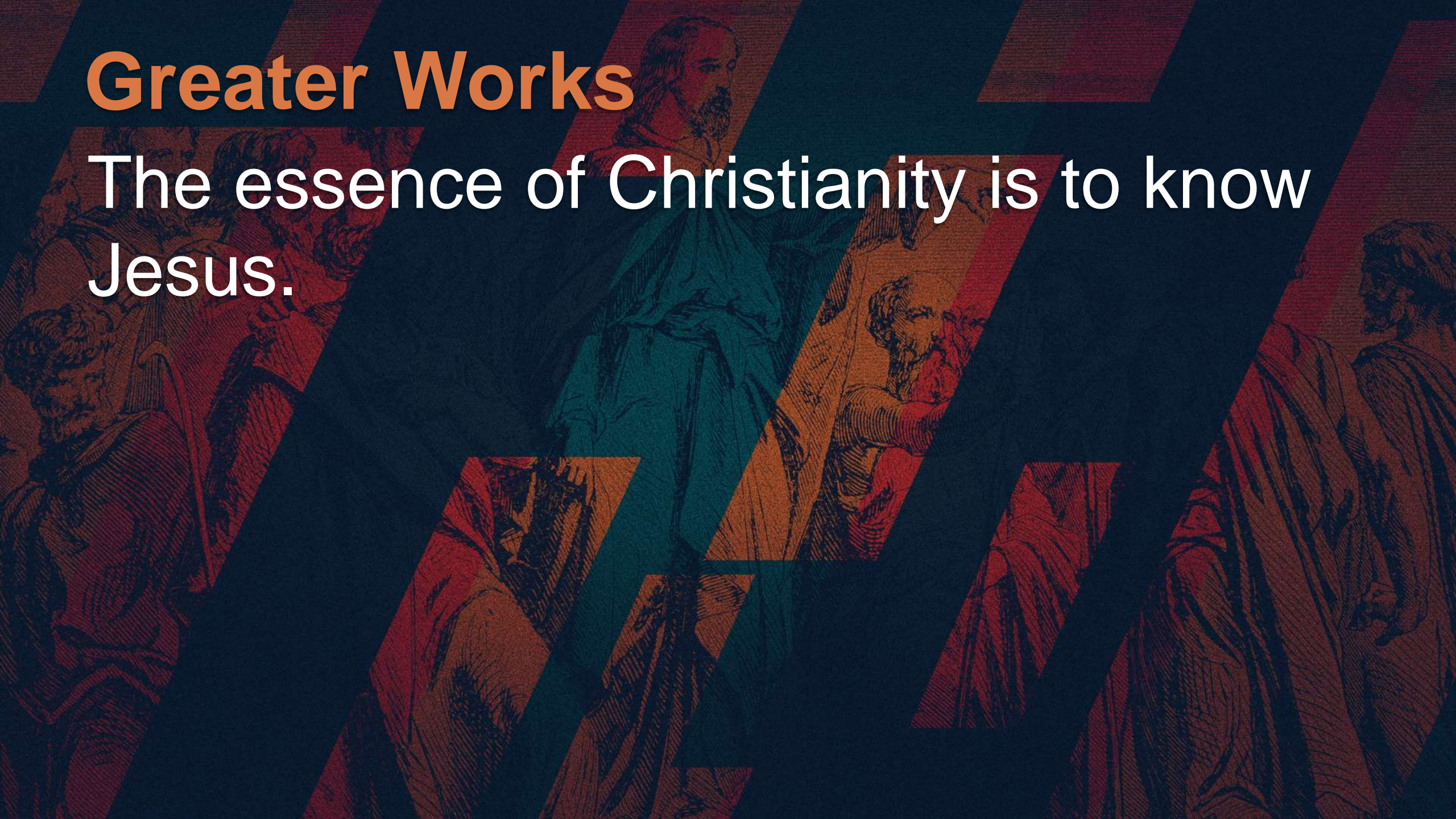
Christianity hinges on us knowing

# John 14:5-7

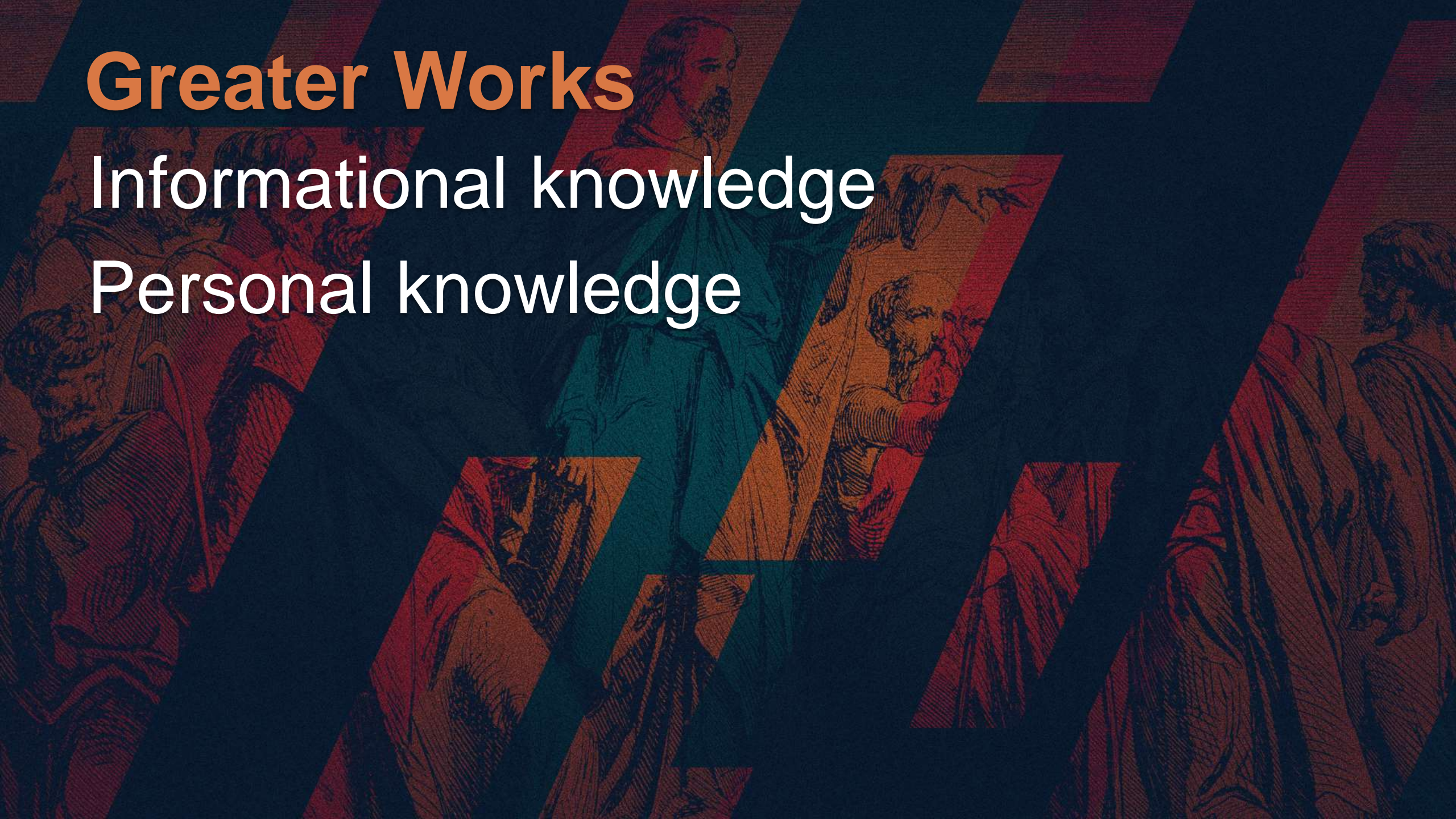
<sup>7</sup> If you had known me, you would have known my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him.”

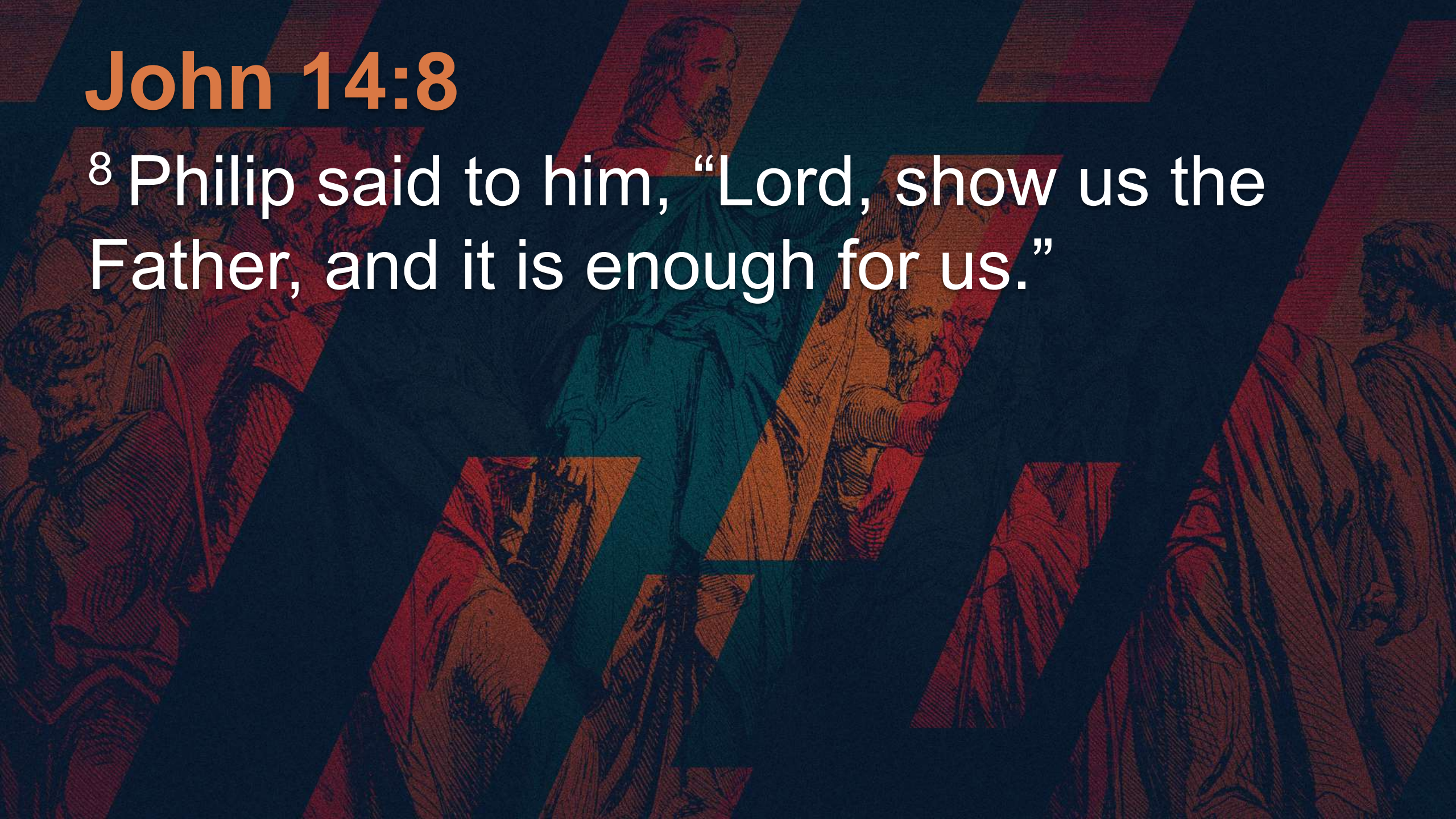
# Greater Works

## John 14:10b-11

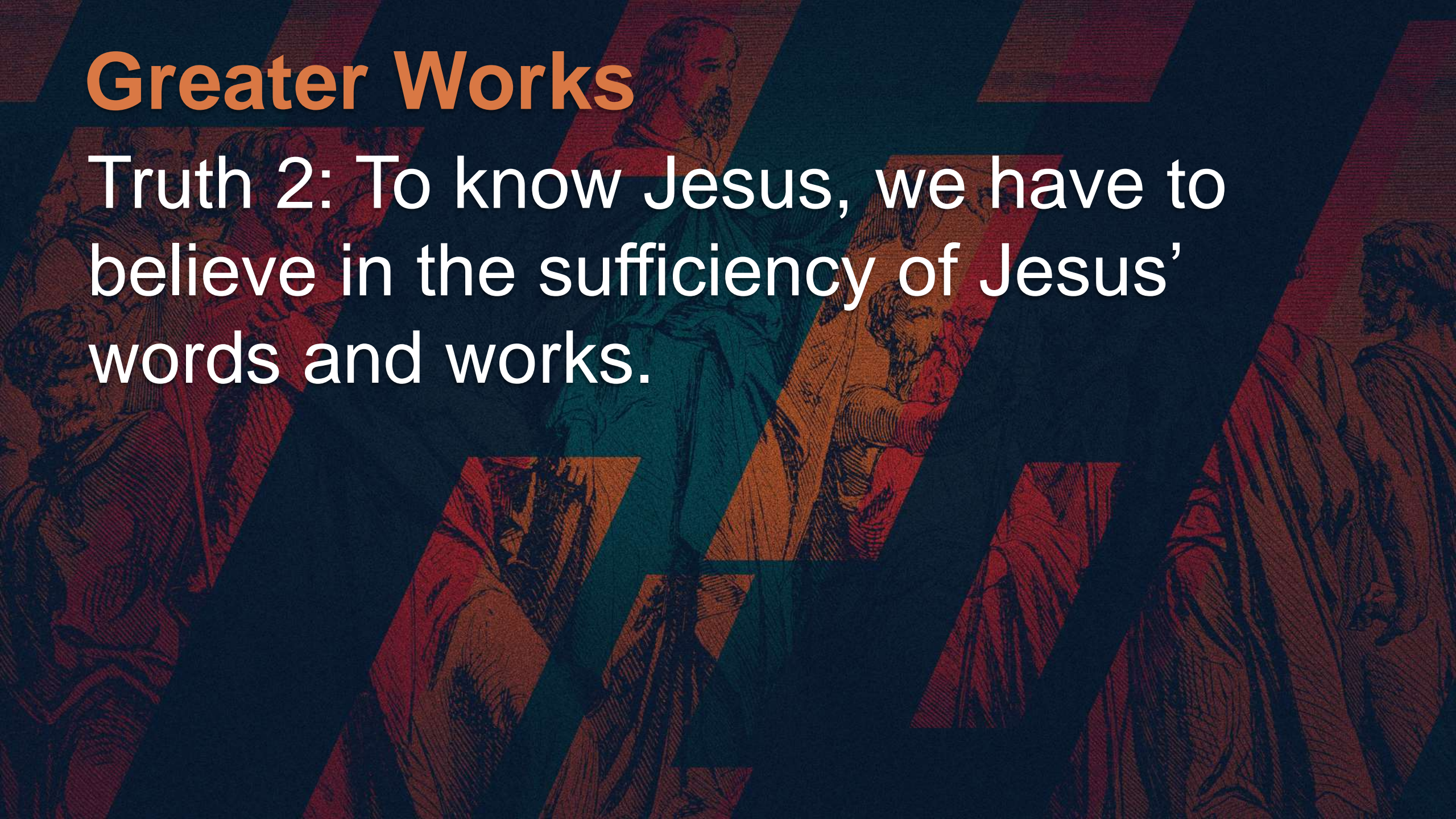
The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works.
