The Anchoring Son

God states His purpose

God makes promises

Guarantees the promise with an oath

The recipients of the promise obtain the promise by believing and patiently waiting

Hebrews 6:17-18a

¹⁷ So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath,

¹⁸ so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie,

There has never been anyone who trusted in God's promises and was finally disappointed. God may delay the visible answers to His promises because He always answers in his time, not in ours...and we may not see the answer until we're in heaven. But He is completely trustworthy to keep His Word. Ultimately, He has promised eternal salvation to the one who has faith in Jesus, and we can count on that as absolute truth!
